What do they need to take into consideration in order to make the decision?

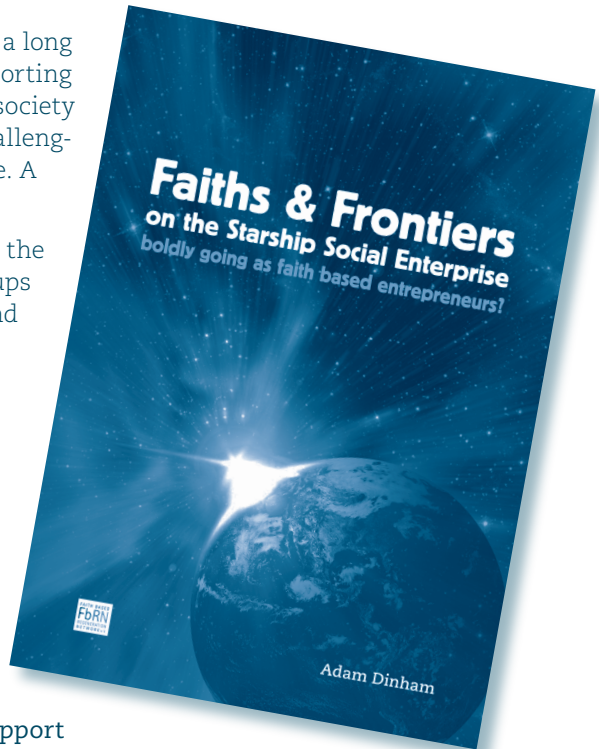
What skills, knowledge and support will they need?
