1. We Refugees: 80 years on

77 years ago Hannah Arendt published her short article 'We Refugees'. A refugee herself, Arendt goes beyond the condition of refugee and person without a country and proposes that we should see this as the condition of a new historical consciousness. This session revisits Arendt's brief essay in the light of the ongoing 'refugee crisis' to explore if her analysis has lost any of its currency in the 'age of globalization' and the 'decline of nation-state'. A lecture by Gholam Khiabany.

This lecture will be delivered twice to enable as many students as possible to attend, although attendance will be optional. The lecture will be delivered on Thursday 25 February 2021 at 11am-12pm and repeated on Thursday 11 March 2021 at 11am-12pm.



2. Doing a Dissertation

Doing a dissertation: this session will help students understand the requirements of doing a dissertation at MA level; the importance of formulating the right research questions; and how to organise your research time and writing. Led by Natalie Fenton.
