Studies in Professional Issues and Research in Education	Module taught through lectures and seminar sessions, which require students to complete pre-session and follow up reading to support their praxis. 3 hours online lectures, 170 Practical Experience hours, 100 independent study hours, 27 online seminars/tutorials and collaborative working with peers online. This module will be delivered online.	No change
Subject Studies	Module consists of a minimum of 30 subject specific seminar group hours. Additional learning opportunities include practice in the classroom and self-study, which equate to a minimum of 270 hours. Each subject specific seminar group on-campus once a week.	No change
School Experience	Module includes taught sessions (10 lectures and 20 seminar/tutorial hours) at Goldsmiths and 120 days School Experience. 20% of taught sessions to take place in-person on-campus.	No change
