The BA (Hons) Acting and Performance Making is a bold, process-driven degree for creatives who want to forge their own path in contemporary theatre and performance. Rooted in exploration, collaboration, and experimentation, the programme nurtures complete theatre makers who are both creative practitioners and critical thinkers. We will equip you with the skills, insight, and confidence to lead in a changing world. You will be encouraged to become active agents in your own learning, embracing devising processes, interdisciplinary practice, research strategies and risk-taking as essential tools for discovery. This is not a conservatoire course, but a dynamic training that combines practical, conceptual, and professional development, enabling each artist to build a diverse creative toolkit. The curriculum is globally engaged, decolonised, and grounded in ethical, ecological, and socially conscious frameworks. Learning takes place within a vibrant community of peers, practitioners, and researchers, supported by a strong alumni network and a blend of research-led and practitioner-led teaching. Graduates emerge as critically informed, politically engaged, and creatively fearless path forgers - ready to shape the future of performance on their own terms.

8. Learning, Teaching & Assessment

Learning & Teaching methods

Teaching will be via a range of formats to be as relevant as possible to the topic and learning outcomes. This may be through workshops, practical labs, lectures and seminars. It may have a mix of in-person and online activities, designed to give you the best learning experience and to make the most out of your time on campus. You are expected to attend all your timetabled learning activities.

Specifically, this programme will be taught in the following ways:

Skills-based modules will be taught through a combination of practical large and small-group workshops, and technique classes focused on characterisation, voice and movement. Teaching on the Performance Making modules includes practical demonstrations and specialist scenographic workshops, making and devising sessions, small group supervisions, and staff-led and/or staff-supervised rehearsals. You will further engage in lectures and seminars that will support you to contextualise and analyse the practical work you are completing and its relation to existing practice. Finally, you will also be taught through one-to-one supervisions and tutorials.

Assessment modes and approaches

You will be assessed in a range ways throughout your course. These will be both Formative (for feedback and development), and Summative (required to pass and progress to the next level). Summative assessments are compulsory.

Feedback is a crucial part of your learning and development in this programme. You will receive feedback both on your Formative (work in progress) tasks/assessments, and your Summative (graded) assessments. This feedback will help the assessment to be a part of your learning, not just a test. It may be verbal, written or video based. Please engage with this feedback to improve your future work.
