

Progression Agreement Between Goldsmiths, University of London and Lewisham College 2025

Introduction

At Goldsmiths, we're committed to promoting access and diversity in higher education, which is clearly reflected in the diversity of our student population. We recognise our responsibility to provide an accessible pathway to higher education for local learners. For this reason and in recognition of the relationship between Goldsmiths, University of London and Lewisham College, we have established Progression Agreements, which grants the following admissions benefits to students applying to our undergraduate degree programmes.

Progression agreement offers are subject to an application being submitted via UCAS which would include a personal statement relevant to the subject applied for. An offer cannot be guaranteed where the personal statement is not considered suitable. Goldsmiths will request a new statement where necessary. Any additional requirements must also be met as detailed below.

Lewisham College qualifications must be full Level 3 qualifications evaluated by Goldsmiths as equivalent to three full A Levels. Examples of progression offers are as follows, please note there may be some slight variation between programmes:

The typical Goldsmiths A level offer is B B B. One grade lower would be B B C.

The typical Goldsmiths BTEC offer is D D M. One grade lower would be D M M.

The typical Goldsmiths Access to HE Diploma offer is Pass with 45 Level 3 credits including 30 Distinctions with the remaining awarded at Merit/Pass. One grade lower could be expressed as Pass with 45 Level 3 credits including 21 Distinctions, 12 Merits and the remaining awarded at Merit/Pass in subject-specific modules.

The Goldsmiths offer for the UAL Extended Diploma is Merit. Due to the nature of grading on this qualification the typical offer will remain as Merit.

This Progression Agreement will be reviewed each year as part of the general memorandum of understanding between Goldsmiths and Lewisham College.

Goldsmiths' Undergraduate programmes and their respective admission benefits

Goldsmiths' programmes have been divided into two categories for the purposes of this agreement:

1. Practice programmes offering guaranteed interviews within the limits of current admissions practice and any portfolio/qualification requirements being met
2. Programmes offering a guaranteed offer at one grade lower than advertised. (The offer is only guaranteed where your personal statement is of a suitable quality and where the entry requirements are met, i.e. if the advertised requirement is BBB, you must achieve BBC.)

1) Programmes offering guaranteed interviews:

- BA Fine Art (Portfolio will also be required at interview.)
- BA Fine Art and History of Art (Portfolio will also be required at interview.)
- BA Design (Portfolio will also be required at interview.)

- BA English and Creative Writing (Submission of recent written work of an appropriate standard also required as part of a student's application.)
- BA Applied Psychosocial and Psychotherapy Studies
- BA Social Science, Community Development and Youth Work (Work experience required as part of the entry requirements.)
- BMus Music (Portfolio will also be required at interview. Grade 8 in your main instrument from the Associate Board of the Royal Schools of Music required as part of the entry requirements.)
- BMus Popular Music (Portfolio will also be required at interview. You should be able to demonstrate skills and experience in both practical musicianship and music creation.)
