What kinds of graduate employers might be interested in me?

Here are some ideas to get you started but you can relate your degree to many more sectors.

Art and design

Many graduates work as freelance artists and designers while some go on to set up their own design studios. As a commercial artist you will be commissioned to create work for public spaces, private companies and charities. As a designer you may work in areas such as graphic or industrial design. Whatever area you choose to specialise in you will work to deadlines and produce original ideas in response to briefs set out by the clients.

Education

You could pass on your skills to others by teaching art and design, craft or technology as part of the national curriculum. You could also work as a design educator in a museum or other kind of learning centre, sharing your creative application of design in more informal educational environments.

Media and advertising

This industry is fast, exciting, innovative and highly creative. You will use your creative skills to produce design solutions that can effectively communicate client messages with high visual impact. You may choose to specialise in web or multimedia design and will work to maintain websites and interactive online marketing tools. Your skills will enable companies to raise their profiles and engage with consumers.
